Parents' Meetings and Options Evenings

During the Lent term, there will be no activities offered on Wednesday evenings. This is due to a heavy schedule of parents' meetings and options evenings on

Year 11 & VI Form Practice Examinations

Students are reminded to prepare for the practice examinations beginning in the first week of our return. A detailed revision plan and timetable will help students to organise their time effectively and give of their best during this period. These examinations will be used to identify appropriate tiers of entry (such as Foundation or Higher, Core or Extended) and may be required as evidence of attainment if it is decided by Government to postpone examinations in summer 2021.

Day students are not to be on site at all during this period. This continues our efforts to keep the boarders staying with us over the Christmas break safe and Covid-secure.

Festive writing competitions



Myddelton College has been selected by Microsoft as a 2020-2021 Microsoft Showcase School.






Our Head Girl, Katie Balmer, was a finalist in the Rising Star category of the Independent Schools of the Year Awards 2020.

Jessica and Matthew (Y10) have been nominated for ISA Schools 'Athlete of the term'.


Boarders
