### **Examinations: Summer 2021**

Earlier this week Kirsty Williams CBE MS, Minister for Education in Wales announced that students would not be sitting examinations in their existing format for GCSE, AS and A Level qualifications in Wales during summer 2021. The detail of exactly which qualifications this affects and the alternative provisions for those qualifications has yet to be decided by the Minister and the first meeting of the advisory group is being held today.

#### The Minister outlined:

- that in place of exams, the Welsh Government intends to work with schools and colleges to take forward teacher-managed assessments
- that this should include assessments that will be externally set and marked but delivered within a classroom environment under teacher supervision
- her expectation this work will form the basis for centre-based outcomes which will be linked to an agreed national approach to provide consistency across Wales

My expectation is that the direction to cancel examinations relates only to GCSE, AS and A Level qualifications offered by WJEC (not WJEC Eduqas) and this would only affect the following subjects:

- Art & Design (GCSE, AS & A Level)
- Geography (AS Level)
- Government & Politics (AS & A Level)
- History (GCSE, AS & A Level)
- Welsh (GCSE)

This would mean that qualifications awarded by AQA, CAIE, Edexcel/Pearson and WJEC Eduqas should continue as normal with those examinations listed in the specification taking place in summer 2021. For some of these examinations, content has been reduced and teachers have informed students where this is the case. Additionally, the Awarding Body examinations timetables have been adjusted with start dates being pushed back by three weeks.

It is vital that students are prepared for all potential eventualities. I expect students to continue to focus and work hard in every lesson; part of the centre-based outcomes may be dependent upon externally moderated samples of student work gathered throughout the year.

I will be monitoring the situation closely to ensure that the Myddelton College community are kept informed as it continues to evolve.

The TopYa! Active app is committed to online safety and meets rigorous COPPA and GDPR safeguarding standards. No one can communicate within the app. All children can only communicate with one another through a virtual 'high-five', which functions like a social media 'like'. Video content has been approved by Independent Sports Association and is suitable for children. Every video is reviewed and approved or declined by certified and trained adults (Virtual Coaches) to make certain that no inappropriate or irrelevant videos are uploaded to the app. Parental control settings are available on each student's account. As well, any child under the age of 13 will be required to connect a parent account.
