Vehicle Speed:

To ensure the safety of students, parents and staff, visitors to and from the campus are respectfully reminded to observe a maximum speed limit of 5mph whilst on College grounds.

The roads around the College are very narrow and used by local school children and other members of the public and therefore visitors are asked to be mindful of maintaining an appropriate speed to also protect our neighbours and local community.

Be Allergy Aware

There are a number of pupils attending Myddelton College who have severe nut or sesame seed allergies. The pupils' anaphylaxis (allergic reaction) can occur as a result of digestion, inhalation or any other contact with nut or sesame seed based products. For their safety, all nut and sesame seed based products have been banned from the College premises.

Therefore, we kindly ask please do not send your child in with any nut or sesame seed based product for a snack or packed lunch – this includes products that may contain traces of nuts or sesame seeds. Potential allergens could include the following:

- Spreads, e.g. chocolate spread
- Cereal bars
- Some types of biscuit containing nuts
- Condiments, e.g. satay sauce
- Cakes containing nuts
- Some snack pots containing nuts

It is important that you check the labelling of food products before sending your child in to school with them – it is not always apparent that products contain nuts or sesame seeds or traces of nuts or sesame seeds.

Duke of Edinburgh's Award Expedition

On the 26th – 27th September, we will be offering a Duke of Edinburgh Bronze Assessment and Silver Training expedition over the course of the weekend; this will be available for candidates currently registered for the award and primarily aimed at current Bronze candidates in Year 10 and Silver candidates in Year 11.

The duration for both expeditions will be two days and one night as to meet the requirements for the awards and will be completed on foot; utilising our college grounds, locality to the Clwydian Hills and the Clwyd Valley. Please note that while we will meet at College on the Saturday to begin the weekend, we may ask for the students to be collected from elsewhere on the Sunday.

We ask that for those who wish to attend this weekend to please bring a tent for camping, thus, candidates will be able to distance themselves overnight appropriately. We are able to utilise the college tents, however, at a tent per person our numbers are limited so it is strongly advised to bring one if possible. Candidates will not be expected to carry their tents whilst walking. If you feel strongly that you do not wish for your son/daughter to camp, arrangements can be made for an evening pick up and morning drop off the following day.

There will be a fee of £10 for the weekend.

The Duke of Edinburgh award have worked hard throughout these unprecedented circumstances to offer flexibility at each level of the award; therefore, the college aims to provide an expedition that is:

- 1. In keeping with the spirit of the Duke of Edinburgh Award Scheme
- 2. Appropriately managed to ensure that candidates can get the most out of their expedition experience
- 3. Operating safely to reduce the risk and spread of COVID 19
