It has been a delight to welcome our students back this week. In my assembly on Wednesday I said to the students that this is a September like no other and never before has a school year started with such a need for routine and yet such uncertainty at what might lie ahead. The way that they have all adapted to the new measures that we have put in place has been impressive.

The resilience that our students demonstrated during lockdown made me very proud, however, it is the resilience of our new Myddeltonians including boarders that must be acknowledged. Not only are they facing the uncertainty of what a new school year will bring, but they are facing this in an unfamiliar place. Several of these students are in quarantine, working remotely unable to socialise or work in school at this moment in time. I am impressed that my VI Form Prefects have decided to speak to these students through Microsoft Teams, to ensure that they feel supported and to prepare them for their return back to Myddelton. It is this calm, kind, family atmosphere that we strive for at Myddelton and I have seen this from Lower Prep to Upper VI already in the few days that have gone by.

A broad and balanced curriculum is very important to us at Myddelton and I am delighted that we have been able to ensure that we can maintain this despite our COVID measures. Activities begin on Monday and students have the choice from three activities per day for each Year Group. As I discussed at the end of last term, we have removed Year 10 LTTO from our fortnightly timetable and replaced the session with more of our core lessons. I am delighted that Mr Eastabrook will be offering a structured programme for those students keen to continue LTTO, which will incorporate all of the key values of the outdoors, adventure and the opportunity to complete the Bronze, Silver and Gold Duke of Edinburgh's Award. These will be known as Year 10 LTTO Adventure days.

We will be having some new publicity pictures taken for our website and marketing literature on Monday 21st September. If you are happy to send your son/daughter into school on that day in school uniform, it would be appreciated. If you have not ordered uniform yet, please don't worry you can continue to send your son/daughter in their casual clothes.

I hope that you have a lovely weekend and I look forward to another busy week at Myddelton.


