Barcelona Trip: 18th – 24th April 2022: Year 10, 11 and Lower VI.

I am excited to officially launch our first Spanish trip to the city where I am from: the amazing city of Barcelona! This is an incredible opportunity to learn more about the culture, language and traditions of Spain. The trip is open to students of Spanish from Year 10, 11 and Lower VI. The maximum number is 15. As well as visiting some of the most iconic



tourist attractions, learning about traditions and trying delicious food of the region, students will join three days of lessons in a fantastic school in Barcelona where they will be able to learn how Spanish schools operate, practise and improve Spanish and make friends.

Pen Pal Schools

This Half Term, Students from Year 7 to GCSE are starting a beautiful project on the online platform <u>Pen Pal Schools</u>.

Pen Pal School connects over a quarter of a million students from 150 countries to learn together! Students collaborate through online projects whilst practising literacy. Students are only invited by a verified teacher, Miss Alos. Teachers and parents can follow their progress. Firstly, our Myddeltonians will learn about aspects of the Hispanic World such as daily life there, food and popular culture.

Enroll your child in collaborative topics.

Monitor your child's discussions. See the lessons that your child reads.

Then, using only Spanish, pupils create their own profile and write about their own country and town, life (food, hobbies, traditions, etc.). Practising all the grammar and vocabulary studied this academic year and will consolidate all their learning thorough this fantastic project. They will also have to read opinions written in Spanish by other students from around the world and reply to at least 3 of them.

Expeditions Update

2021-2022 Expeditions

As mentioned last week, there are two expeditions planned for 2022. Mr Eastabrook has compiled some information regarding the two trips and would welcome an email from any parents wishing to discuss the expeditions further before students can apply for places. Applications will open in September with early notice now, so that students can start working their summer jobs to fund them. Please contact <u>Mr Eastabrook</u> for more details.

In **February 2022**, we are pleased to run **Ski Trip**! Students will depart and arrive back from College for a week of Europe's finest slopes. Equipment hire, lessons and support will be offered to those wishing to learn, with more freedom for the more experienced skier around. This is an experience I would encourage everyone to undertake at least once. There are limited spaces, and places will be awarded by application once they open in September. I cannot recommend a ski trip like this enough, as one of the most affordable ways to get into the mountains and experience the thrill of skiing, learning a new skill and going away with you friends. The cost of this trip is £999 per student, which is good value, considering lift passes to access the mountains represent 25% of this cost.





In **July 2022**, we are proud to launch Myddelton College's inaugural expedition to the mighty **Yukon River, Canada**. It is a wild place, rich in history and an ideal place for an expedition in a true sense of the word. Students will be spending 12 days descending the river, wild camping along the way, covering 450km along the Teslin and Yukon Rivers. During this time, the student will use their adventure skills to live effectivity and undertake one science-based and one arts-based project.

The trip will be aiming to return to the UK following the end of term. This will give us great weather and ideal river levels for the trip. We will be away for 16 days that gives us a couple of traveling days, a couple of days to get our supplies organised for the trip and a day of R&R before our return. A full itinerary will be developed by the students. Similarly, in September 2022, the students will host an evening for all to report back on their arts and science projects. The cost of the trip will be £2,750 plus students may need to purchase a few items for the trip. While this is a lot of money, British Exploring run this trip for £3,500 plus flights so is good value for the programme and experience on offer.

Preparatory School Update

It has been a fabulous first week back for the Prep School. We have made the most of beautiful weather this week during our after school activities. Both sports club, where we used our new kit from Premier League Primary Stars, and gardening club, where we planted summer squash and kohlrabi, took place out in the sunshine and were a huge hit!

Upper Prep have been busy beginning their new maths and English units. In maths, we have been learning about area and perimeter and in English we have begun identifying the features of a newspaper article in preparation for our sentence stacking lessons next week. We have also enjoyed learning about the Mayan number system and creating dream catchers inspired by the work of Mexican artist, Leonora Carrington. In our science lessons this week, we have begun investigating the question 'Does the amount of light affect the growth of plants?' To help us understand how different plants grow within the different layers of the rainforest.



Lower Prep have been practising their mastery skills in English this week through recounting Mr Toad's escape from prison, dressed as a washerwoman. In maths, they have been exploring length and perimeter. We have enjoyed the good weather too, as in science lessons, we have been exploring 'What is a Plant?', so we have spent lots of time outdoors. In our topic lessons, we have explored erosion and deposition and how this forms meanders in a river course.










One Way System Reminder
