



## Myddelton College : Ethos and Aims

Myddelton College is situated within the attractive market town of Denbigh, North Wales, and is sited on a south-easterly facing terrace with stunning south facing views across 35 acres of playing fields, with the Clwydian Hills beyond, and Denbigh Castle behind.

The school accepted its first pupil intake in 2016; boarding and day numbers have grown steadily each year and reached 325 girls and boys, ranging from 4 - 18 years, in 2023. The school occupies the buildings of the former Howell's School which closed in 2013.

Increasing numbers of girls and boys of all ages are choosing Myddelton because it is a happy, caring and academically successful school, with a wide range of opportunities.
